

ENTERING QUEENSLAND FROM INTERSTATE

The Queensland Government's requirements for all persons entering Queensland have been updated. To ensure a COVID Safe environment it is important to stay up-to-date with current Queensland border restrictions and declared COVID-19 hotspots.

- All persons entering Queensland from interstate are required to complete a Queensland Entry Pass
 - If you are a NSW Border Zone resident who has not been outside the border zone in the prior 14 days, please complete a <u>Border Zone Travel (X) Pass</u>.
 - If you are only entering Queensland in the course of your employment in freight and logistics (ie commercial horse transports), please complete a <u>Freight & Logistics (F) Pass</u>.

ENTERING QUEENSLAND FROM A DECLARED COVID-19 HOTSPOT

If you are entering Queensland from a <u>declared COVID-19</u> <u>hotspot</u> - currently all of NSW, Victoria, and ACT, the Local Government Areas of Greater Adelaide (SA), and Katherine and Robinson River (NT), you must comply with the following border directions to be permitted entry to Queensland as a 'hotspot traveller'.

Effective 1 January 2022, to enter Queensland as a 'hotspot traveller' and not be subject to quarantine requirements, you must:

- 1. Have your approved Queensland Entry Pass; and
- Be fully vaccinated (at least seven days post second dose) and have proof of vaccination status, or have verified evidence of a medical exemption from COVID-19 vaccination recorded by an eligible health professional on the Australian Immunisation Register; and
- 3. Have a negative COVID-19 Rapid Antigen Test conducted at a COVID-19 hotspot within 72 hours **prior to arrival** in Queensland.

Important notes regarding hotspot travellers:

- Submission of a Queensland Entry Pass declaration is attesting to having completed a negative Rapid Antigen Test and heavy penalties apply for making a false declaration
- Children under 16 years of age are considered fully vaccinated for the purpose of this border direction.
- There are no age exemptions to the COVID-19 Rapid Antigen testing, this requirement applies to adults and children of all ages entering Queensland from a hotspot.
- Effective 28 December 2021, hotspot travellers are no longer required to get a COVID-19 PCR test on day 5 following their arrival in Queensland.
